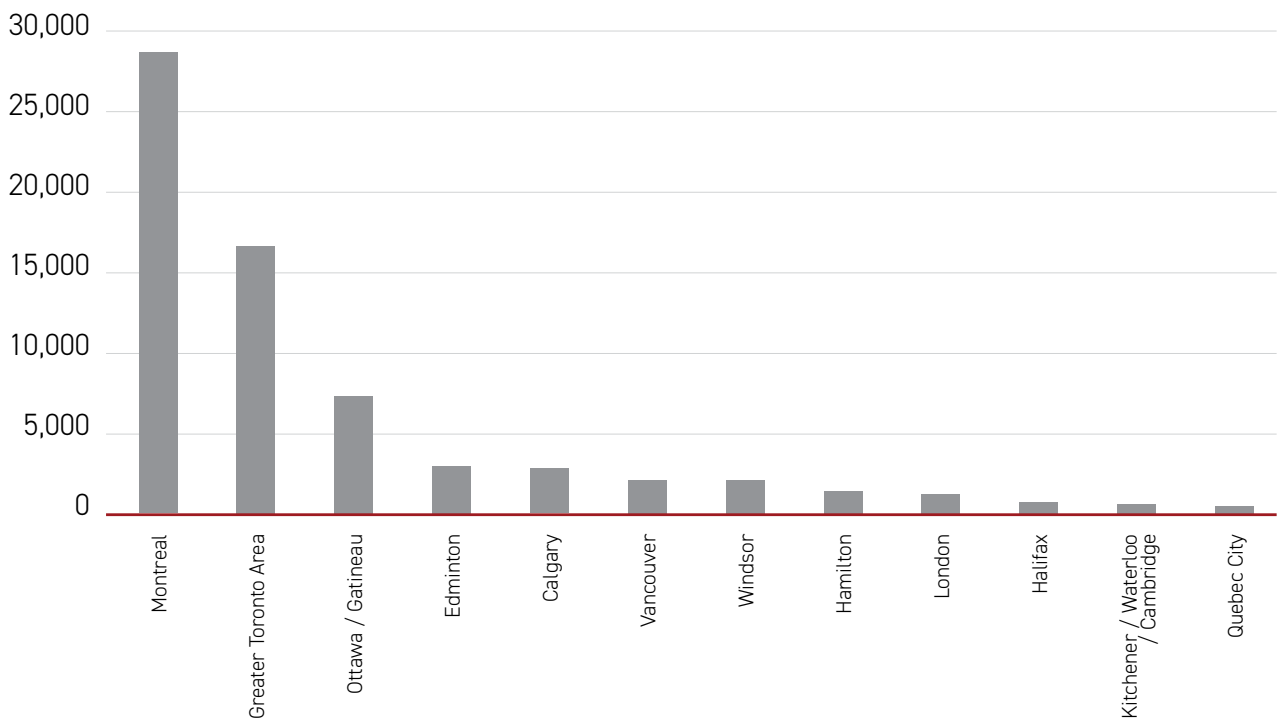

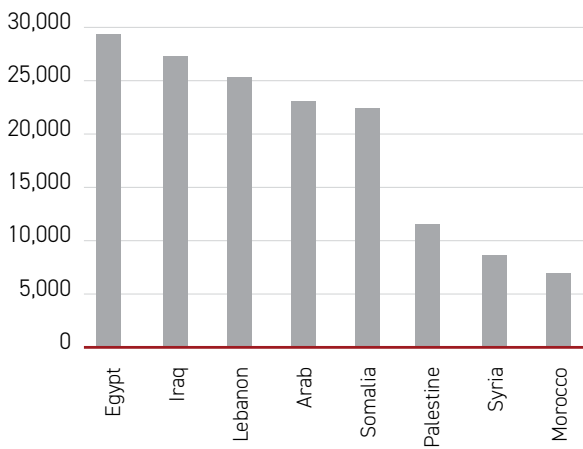

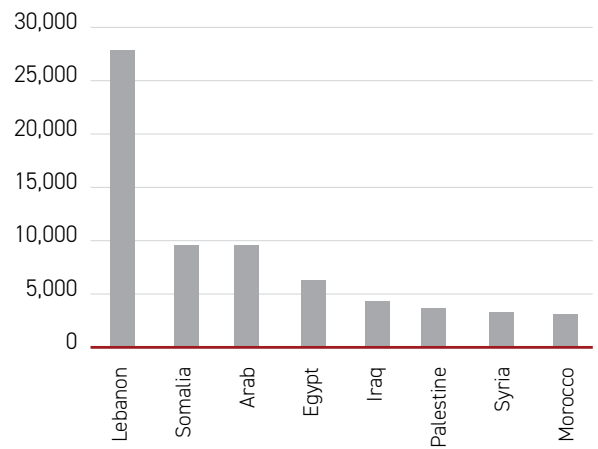

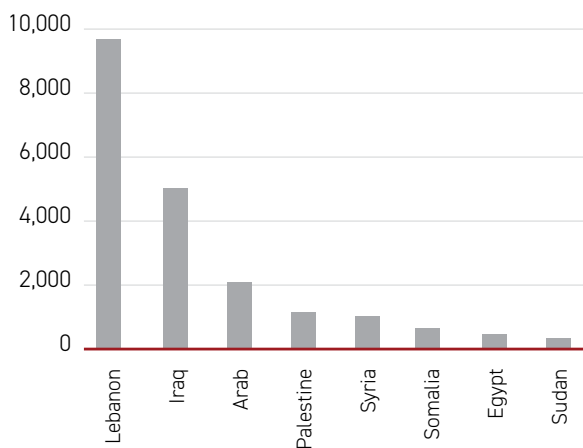
Total Population of Canadian Arabs in the Greater Toronto Area



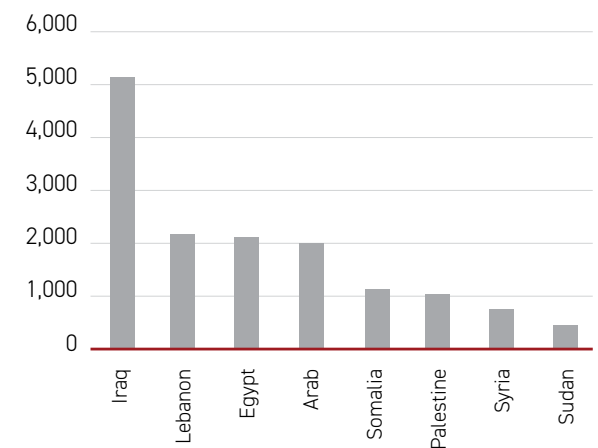
Total Population of Canadian Arabs in Ottawa / Gatineau



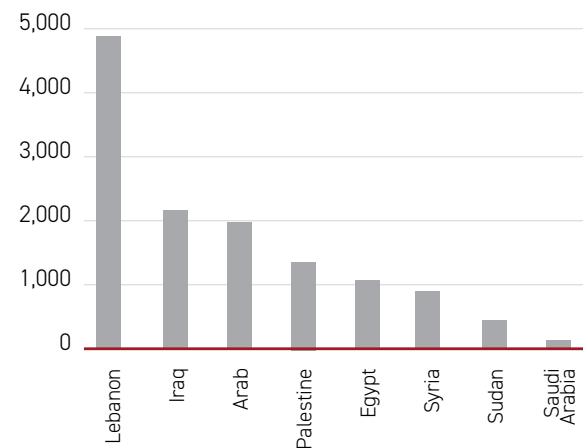
Total Population of Canadian Arabs in Windsor

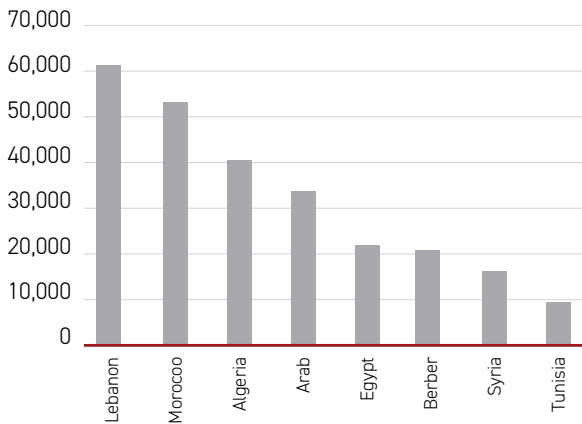

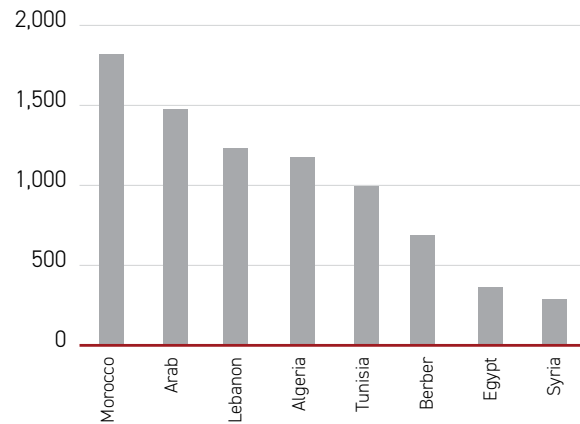

Total Population of Canadian Arabs in Montreal

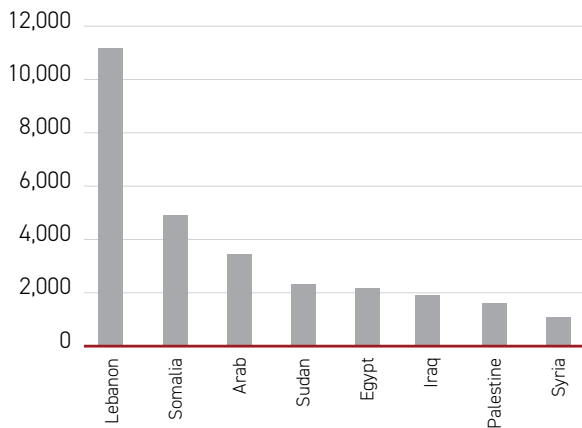


Total Population of Canadian Arabs in Quebec City

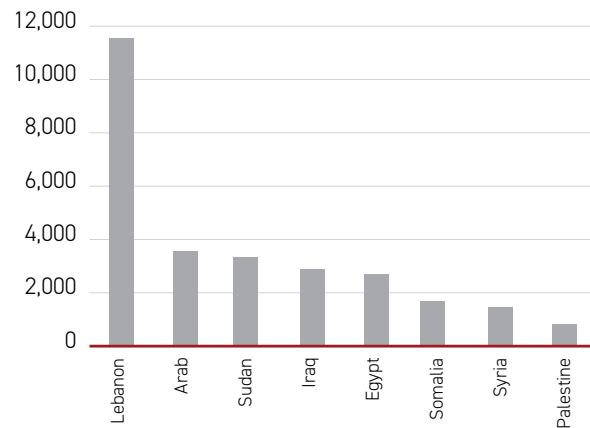

Total Population of Canadian Arabs in Edmonton

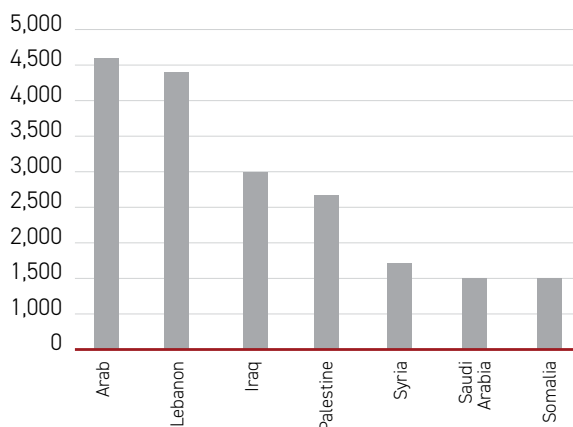


Total Population of Canadian Arabs in Calgary



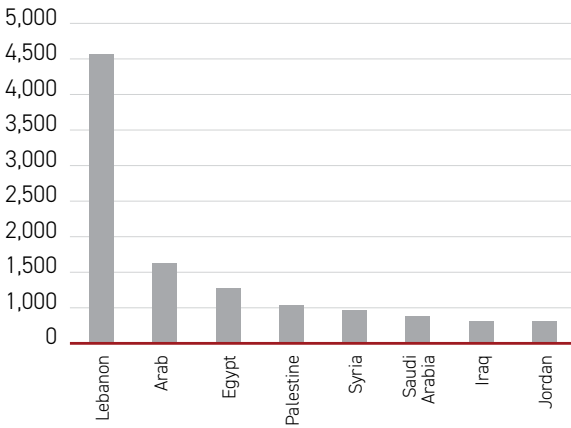
